> * There are a total of 360 panels installed; 120 on the roof of the church and 240 on the carport array.

> > ***** The total size of the system is 110 kilowatts.

* At this time, 60% of the total electrical usage of the church, office, rectory, and Parish Activities Center will be provided by the sun - enough power to run approximately 14 average homes.

The system will harness approximately 14,300 kilowatts each month.

★By reducing our carbon footprint, we are offsetting: 14,500 lbs of coal per month, 7,150 gallons of water saved per month and 425,488 lbs of carbon dioxide annually.

* The total cost of the system was \$552,907.
Because OMOS has a third party financier, there was no out-of-pocket for Our Mother of Sorrows Parish, with the exception of an increase to the insurance premium and installation of wireless internet access equipment.

* Tucson Electric Power will provide an annual rebate to Our Mother of Sorrows Parish up to \$24, 832 until 60% of the total system cost is reached - in other words, for approximately 13 years.

*As rates for electricity rise, we will see even more savings.

Our Mother of Sorrows Parish will own the system free and clear in approximately 13 years.

*Two electrical car charging stations are being installed on the east side under the solar carport array.
