Ronald Stouffer, one of the leading climate modelers in the world, will discuss climate change, the reliability of climate models, and how certain climate scientists are in their findings during his talk “What You Need to Know about Climate Change.”

The purpose of the talk is to help people evaluate statements heard on both sides of the global warming debate and make informed climate choices.

Stouffer is a senior research climatologist who heads the Climate and Ecosystems Group at the Geophysical Fluid Dynamics Laboratory in Princeton, N.J. He has authored more than 100 papers on global climate change and has received a number of awards for his scientific contributions to climate research. He also was a central contributor to the first four Working Group 1 assessment reports produced by the U.N. Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change and has been a chapter author for the 1995, 2001 and 2007 reports.
